Heathwood Lower School is part of the Leighton Linslade School Sports Partnership which develops a series of school games events.

Events have been designed with the INTENT of promoting physical activity, support health and well-being for ALL and are categorised as follows:

PLAY These events are non-competitive, with participation and fun being the focus, targeting students who lack confidence but want to participate because they understand the benefits of physical activity

LEARN These are events for young people who have primarily not taken part in the school games before and may not actively participate in sport and physical activity in or out of school. The intent is to learn new skills and activities.

DEVELOP These events are the first stage of friendly competition, but winning is not the sole focus, in the traditional sense. They may take part in School Sport, however may not participate in the sport outside of school. The emphasis is to create a positive and enjoyable experience. Matches may be competitive but results will not be recorded and School Games Value awards will be presented

COMPETE These events will target young people who are competitive, who may be involved in sport in school and in clubs, Participation in these events MAY see the winners from the Inter-School competition progress to County Finals and beyond if the pathways exist in the sport, gender and age category.

_____ has been chosen to represent Heathwood in the **Girls Football Festival** - this is a **Develop** event. The competition will be at Astral Park Sports and Community Centre, Johnson Drive, LU7 4AY on **Thursday 19th September 2024**. 9.45am - 1.15pm. There will be transport provided to and from the competition.

The children will compete in their PE kit, so please could you ensure their full outdoor PE kit is in school (t-shirt, shorts, tracksuit bottoms (black), sweatshirt (black)).

They will also need: football boots and shin pads, (please let us know if you need help with this) a packed lunch and water bottle, waterproof jacket if the weather is wet.

Spectators are permitted at this event and there will be a Spectator Respect Area on each pitch for supporters.
